THE PROOF IS IN THE PROGRESS

For 75 years, the Jimmy Fund community has helped Dana-Farber remain on the cutting edge of cancer care, ever since Dr. Sidney Farber first pioneered modern chemotherapy in 1947.

Take a look at how dollars raised by our community for more than seven decades have directly supported Dana-Farber's mission to defy cancer:

1950s: The Jimmy Fund Building opens, representing a new era in cancer care. The building houses research labs and clinics in the same facility, establishing Dana-Farber's signature bench-to-bedside approach to treatment.

1970s: Dana-Farber expands clinical care from just pediatric oncology to both pediatric and adult oncology. At the same time, Dana-Farber scientists develop more effective chemotherapy that raises cure rates for adult non-Hodgkin lymphoma from less than 15% to more than 60%.

1980s: Thanks to breakthroughs in cancer drugs, better control of chemotherapy side effects, and the development of procedures to improve tolerance to chemotherapy and radiation, two out of every three children who enter the Jimmy Fund Clinic become cancer-free.

1990s and 2000s: Dana-Farber scientists and researchers make major developments in cancer genetics, proving that a susceptibility to developing cancer can be passed down from one generation to the next. Genes are discovered that increase risks for common types of cancer, such as the MSH2 gene for colon cancer and the BRCA1 gene for breast cancer.

Today: Breakthroughs continue because of support from the Jimmy Fund community, leading to new and innovative cancer treatments, advancements in early detection and prevention, and space expansion and extension of Dana-Farber's reach across New England.

GOLF COMMUNITY HELPS TO USHER IN THE JIMMY FUND'S 75TH

2023 was another successful year for Jimmy Fund Golf presented by Mohegan Sun, with an array of dedicated tournament directors, sponsors, and supporters across the country raising more than \$6.8 million from the fairways through over 140 events that helped the Dana-Farber Campaign fuel Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and the Jimmy Fund's lifesaving mission to defy cancer.

It was a particularly exciting time to be involved with the Jimmy Fund, as 2023 marked a momentous milestone: seventy-five years since the inception of the Jimmy Fund. The original "Jimmy"—a young boy with lymphoma whose name was changed to protect his privacy, and a patient of Dr. Sidney Farber—first shared his story through a 1948 radio broadcast from his hospital bed, raising money for a TV to watch his favorite baseball team, the Boston Braves, while in treatment. That broadcast ended up inspiring more than \$200,000 in donations from across the country, and that generous community of donors is what became known fondly as the Jimmy Fund.

In the decades since, the generosity of millions all over the world has helped the Jimmy Fund directly support Dana-Farber's mission of turning groundbreaking research into lifesaving treatments. The funds raised through Jimmy Fund Golf have led to innovations in cancer therapies, clinical trials, research tools, survivorship programs, and compassionate care initiatives. Most importantly, they've provided the means to allow Dana-Farber to focus on providing expert, equitable care to children and adults, while also advancing the understanding, diagnosis, treatment, cure, and prevention of cancer and related diseases, benefitting both clinicians and patients around the world.

"Jimmy Fund Golf has been an essential part of the impact our larger Jimmy Fund community has had on cancer research and care at Dana-Farber over the last 75 years," says Suzanne Fountain, vice president of the Jimmy Fund. "The funds raised from the fairways have directly moved the needle closer to a world without cancer."

Jimmy Fund Golf extends its sincere gratitude to all golfers, sponsors, and volunteers for everything they have done and continue to do to create a more hopeful, cancer-free future. With each passing season, the golf community helps to save more lives and reduce the burden of cancer worldwide. Enjoy this look back on a memorable 2023 season!




